After graduating high school, Michael joined the United States Marine Corps and proudly served his country. While enlisted, his unit was involved in active duty in both the Cuban Missile Crisis as well as the Bay of Pigs Invasion. Having served as a Marine was something that he held very close to his heart and was extremely proud of until the end. On June 21, 1967, he married Mary Ann Kincaid in Wichita Falls, Texas and from that day forward, the two of them shared a fairytale love story for the next 54 years. Michael had been employed as a Jailer for the Gray County Sheriff’s Office for several years, then Allsup’s and Wal-Mart. He even received his Locksmithing certificate through the mail and tried his hand at that as well. Michael thought himself to be a mechanic, but never quite mastered that! His larger than life personality, humor and love will be missed by so many whom he touched.
