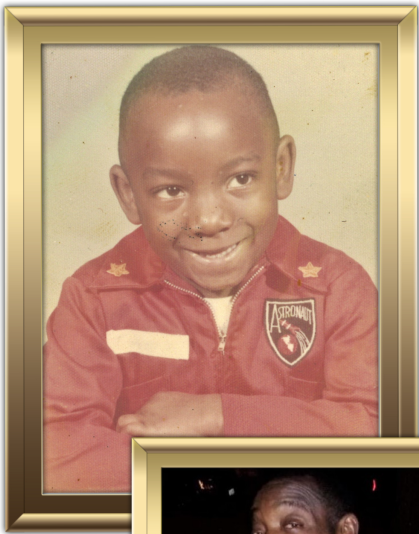
Big Ty was welcomed with open arms into Heaven by his parents, grandmother, Doris Jones and grandfather, Charlie B. Evans.

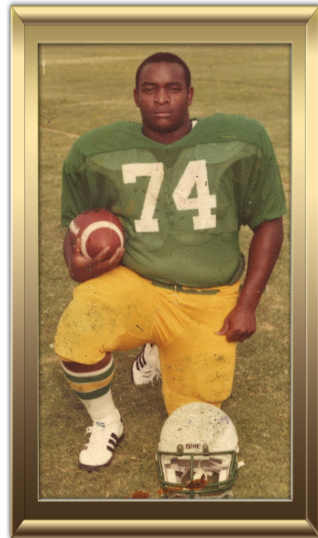
A Letter from Heaven
