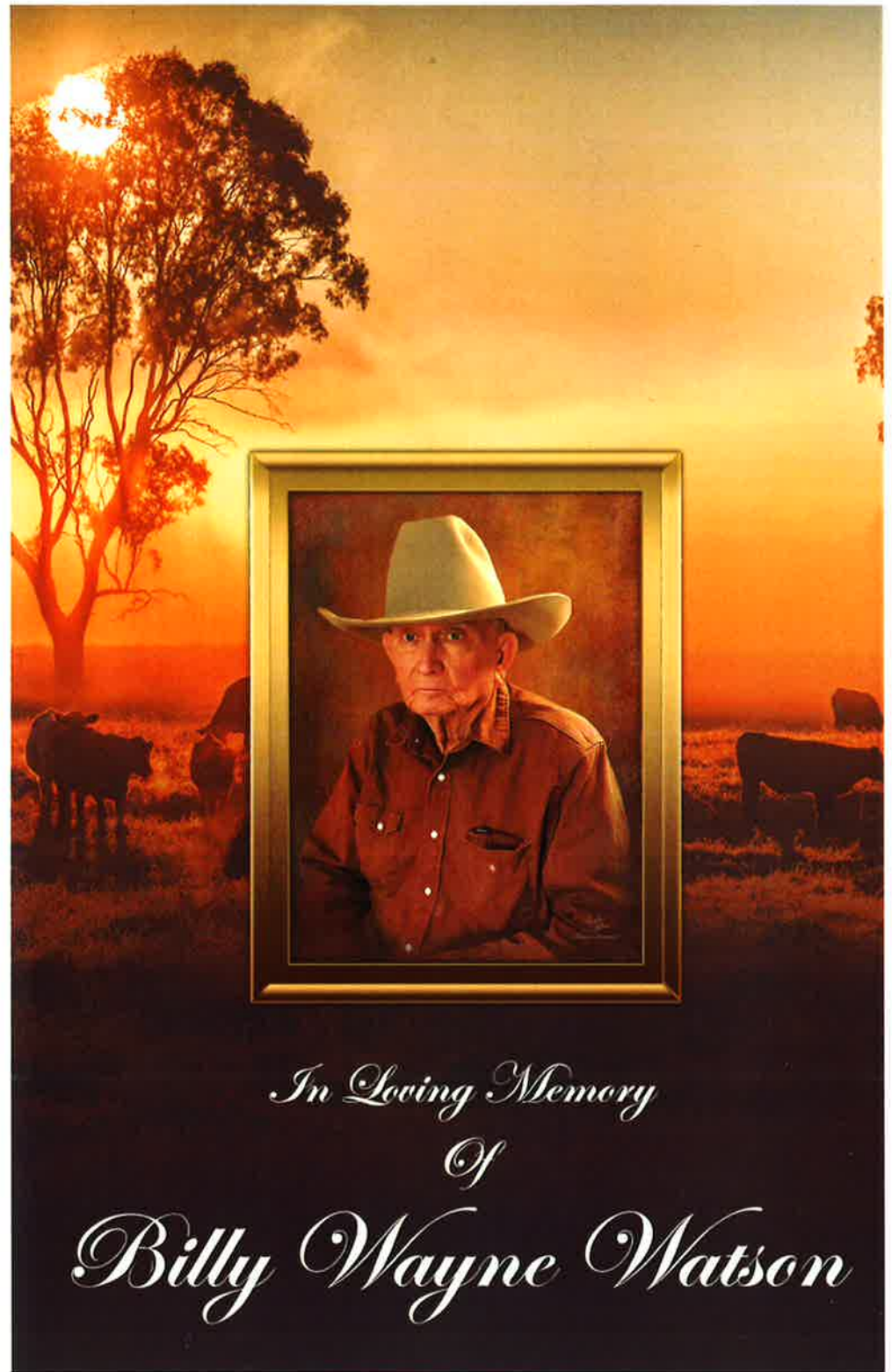
*He was preceded in death by his parents and two brothers, James Willis Watson and Donald "Boots" Watson.*


