In 2016, Sylvester had open heart surgery and had an LVAD (Left Ventricular Assist Device) placed in to help his failing heart.

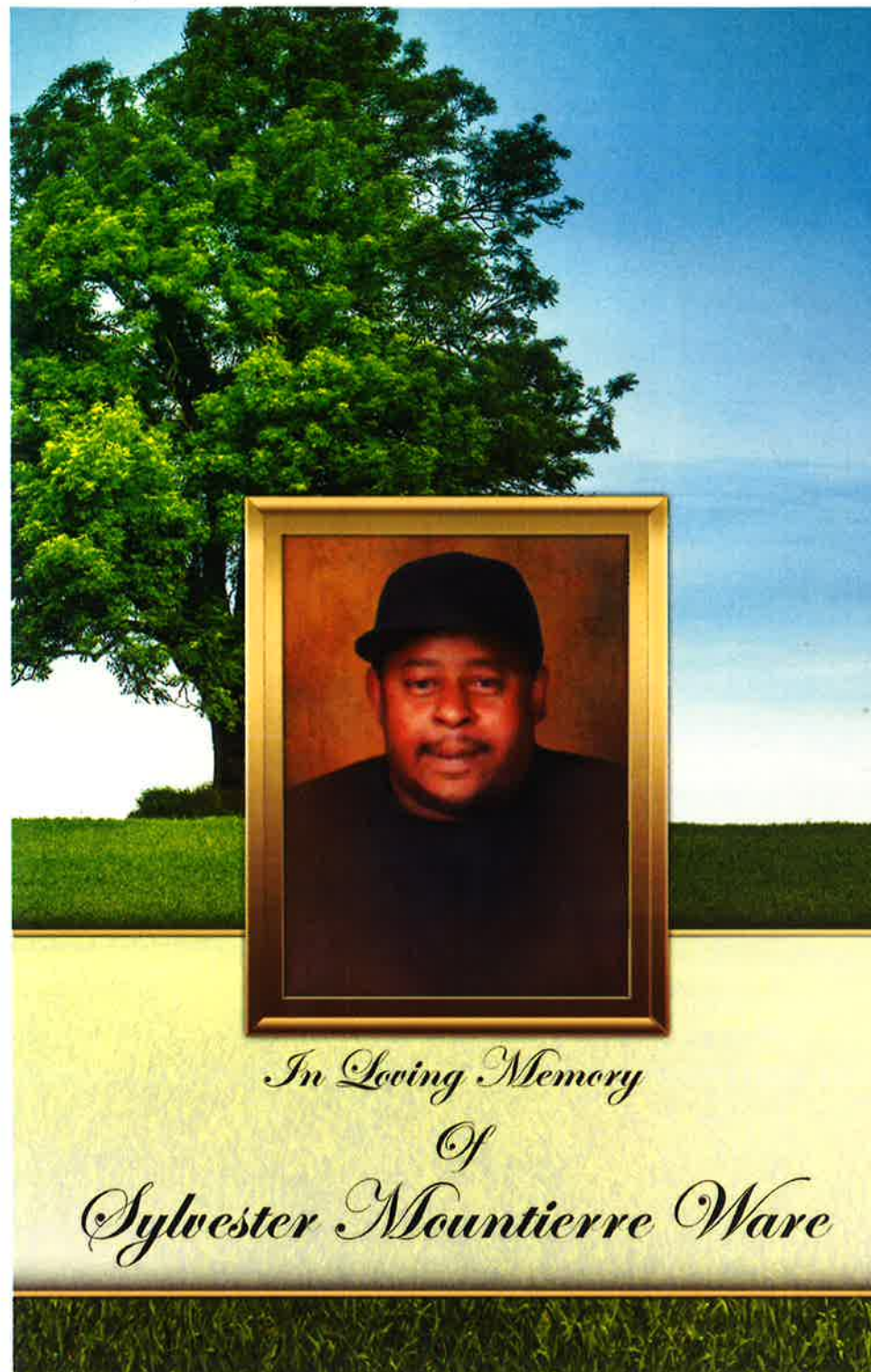
