Don was a member of the Top O' Texas Masonic Lodge 1381 and known and loved by many in the community who will miss his smile and laughter.


Those who anxiously greeted him into heaven are his parents; daughter, Brenda Lee; brother, Terry Tidwell and granddaughter, Laci Tidwell.


